**A NOTE FROM
FR. DANIEL . . .**

This coming **Thursday, November 2nd**, we will hold our annual **Mass of Remembrance at 6:00 pm at Holy Cross**, specifically for all those who lost a

loved one this past year but also for anyone who wants to remember a loved one who has been called home to God. While it is always a difficult time and grieving has no timetable, our faith in Jesus calls us to support each other and pray together during these difficult times. We are spurred on by the words of St.

Paul, "We do not want you to be unaware, about those who have fallen asleep, so that you may not grieve like the rest, who have no hope..." Our hope comes from our faith in Jesus Christ and the power of his resurrection. As we gather to remember those we love, we pray for their eternal rest and their eternal joy with God in the kingdom prepared for each of us from the foundation of the world. We also pray for God to ease our sadness and strengthen our faith. This prayer service, and whenever we pray at a funeral, we are called to remember that we are not alone!! In the Apostles Creed, we profess belief in the Communion of Saints. Simply stated, this means that we believe that we are still in communion (united to) all those who have died. When we pray the litany of Saints, we are asking them to pray for and with us. This belief means that life does not end with death. We believe that the bond of love and family still exists between those who have died and ourselves. It means we can continue to relate to them, speak to them, and ask for their guidance and prayers. For those who can trust in God, and God's love for each and every one of us, reminders of those we love are all around us and scream out that in death life is not ended. Our communion with those we love continues.

As we remember our deceased loved ones this whole month of November, I encourage all to **practice the works of mercy of praying for the dead and caring for their proper burial**. Say a prayer each day this month for those who have gone before us. If you can, visit one of our cemeteries, Saint Anthony in Groton and Saint Patrick in McLean, and pray for those buried there.

This month as we reflect on our duty to offer the dead proper burial, I want to share with you a big concern of mine: our Saint Patrick Cemetery in McLean is in desperate need of some upkeep. There are no funds to provide for it, and in recent years there has been just one volunteer maintaining it. I ask all to consider making a donation specifically for the upkeep of either of our cemeteries (please specify which), and **I strongly encourage all to come forward and volunteer to do some upkeep at Saint Patrick Cemetery in McLean**.

May our loved ones know eternal joy in God, and may God help us to remain connected to them in the Eucharist and in our continued union with God.

YEAR OF THE EUCHARIST



In his Pastoral Letter for the Year of the Eucharist, our bishop says the following: "As a prescribed act of reverence during and continuing after this Year of the Eucharist, I am asking that, where possible (according to existing accommodations for sitting and kneeling), we renew and observe the prescription stated in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, which reads: "In the Dioceses of the United States of America [the faithful] should kneel after the singing or recitation of the Sanctus ("Holy, Holy, Holy") until after the Amen of the Eucharistic Prayer..." and that "The faithful kneel after the Agnus Dei ("Lamb of God")..." (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, no. 43). This normative practice of kneeling truly is a humble manifestation of our reverence be-

fore the One whom we are soon to receive. This solemn time of prayer prepares us interiorly to receive the Christ of the Eucharist as Saint John the Baptist's proclamation, "Behold the Lamb of God, behold Him who takes away the sins of the world..." (John 1:29), unites with the Centurion's ardent profession of faith, "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." (Matthew 8:8)." It has been the practice of our three parishes to kneel after the Sanctus until the amen of the Eucharistic Prayer. Beginning this weekend, according to our shepherd's guidance, we will also kneel after the Lamb of God and until we receive communion. I will be indicating to the congregation when we need to kneel and when we need to stand, so that you do not need to worry about it, until it becomes second nature. Please note that this is only prescribed for those who are easily capable of kneeling; those who would have difficulty doing it do not need to do it. I hope that this practice will help us all deepen our reverence and come closer in our relationship with Christ, truly present in the Most Holy Eucharist.



The people of All Saints, Saint Anthony's, and Holy Cross are a Roman Catholic Community that joyfully embraces our baptismal call to worship God, to preach the Good News of Christ, to teach through Word and sacrament, to build the community of faith and hope in the Holy Spirit, and to serve those who are our neighbors, especially those in need. As pilgrims nourished by the Eucharist for our journey of faith, we are commissioned by the Lord Jesus Christ to reach out together and work with all who seek harmony within the human family to advance the reign of God.





STEWARDSHIP MOMENTS

In today's Gospel Reading from St. Matthew, a lawyer among the Pharisees again tries to entrap Jesus by asking Him the question, "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest." Jesus' response appears multiple times in Holy Scripture, as He says, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind." The Lord then adds another that He cites as almost equally important, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Much has been written and conjectured about both of these, and often the focus is on who our neighbor is. However, there is another element of the second Great Commandment that is worthy of note, and that is loving the neighbor "as yourself." Too often people conclude that this means that you have to love yourself first. Most of us grasp what it means to love the Lord with all we are, although it is nearly unattainable to accomplish. However, that second Great Commandment does not mean that it is necessary for us to love ourselves before we can love anyone else. Jesus is telling us that just as we often think of ourselves, we need to take care and have concern for the interests of others as well. In the familiar Prayer of St. Francis known to many Catholics, we sum up what this kind of love to which we are called really is, when we pray, "Lord, grant that I might not so much seek to be loved, as to love."
