### Baptism

Baptismal preparation is offered and required for parents of children to be baptized in our churches. Please contact the parish office for an initial interview and baptismal preparation.

### Holy Matrimony

Couples must contact the parish office at least six months prior to the celebration. Marriage preparation prerequisites must be fulfilled before the celebration of marriage.

### RCIA/RCIC

Those interested in becoming Catholic or wishing to complete their Christian initiation through the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist are asked to call the parish office.

### Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

This Sacrament is available for individuals upon request, and communal celebrations are periodically scheduled.

### Ministry to the Sick

Please call a parish office concerning the needs of the sick, hospitalized or shut-ins. Those unable to attend Mass may have Communion brought to them.

This Sunday we celebrate the most important of all the Christian feasts. The Resurrection is the center of what we believe. We are a people of joy and peace because we believe that God is victorious over death and sin, because we believe that love and life will triumph. Rejoice the Lord is Risen!

**Easter is not just Easter Sunday, but a whole season that extends for 50 days**, until the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. This season of Easter is the most important liturgical season in the whole year. In this season of Easter, we are invited to become aware of the ways in which God's mercy has been active in our lives freeing us and calling us to the peace of knowing that in and through Christ, we are no longer at odds with ourselves or with God. All has been settled. We are God's beloved children. We are God's friends. We sit at the table of the Eucharist as God's friends. We come to the table broken and burdened by guilt. We are restored by the sacrifice of Christ, and we leave in the peace of being made holy and whole again. When we come to celebrate this meal of friends, when we stand at Calvary to witness the sacrifice of Christ in which we are saved, when we take communion, do we truly accept the love of God that embraces us as his friends and children? That makes us whole? That frees us from the burden of guilt and the fear of punishment? When Mass ends, and by this miracle we are made one with Christ, do we truly go in peace? This season some of the children of our parish will be preparing to celebrate their First Holy Communion later during this same season. Let us all make the commitment to rediscover this most beautiful sacrament with them through this season of Easter. Let us be mindful of how we are restored, healed, made one with our brothers and sisters and with Christ as we come to Mass every Sunday this season. Let us be mindful of this great love of God that never ceases to lay down his life for us and to embrace us in our brokenness. Let us be mindful of the power of his active mercy to be victorious and defeat sin and guilt in us. May we allow this sublime participation in the Most Holy Eucharist to remind us of God's judgment upon us: We are enough, we are good—very good, we are his children, we are his friends, we are his disciples.

**Do you remember when you celebrated your First Eucharist? What was that experience like? Did you experience God in a special way? What does the Eucharist mean to you?**

**Have you ever wondered about some of the things we say or do at Mass? Would you like to understand better what we believe about the Eucharist?**

As we continue to celebrate this Year of the Eucharist, and as our children prepare for their First Communion, I invite all adults to rediscover this beautiful gift of the Most Holy Eucharist. I will be offering a series of three talks in which we will **walk through the Mass step by step**, trying to uncover some of the richness of this sacrament. Each talk will simply pick up where the previous one left so attending the three is recommended. In this case, I will not be offering all three talks at all three parishes; one of the talks will happen at each parish, and we invite people to be adventurous and come to the talks—no matter what parish they are happening at. **The talks will happen from 7:00 to 8:30pm on Wednesday, April 25 at Saint Anthony; Wednesday, May 2 at Holy Cross; and Wednesday, May 9 at All Saints.**

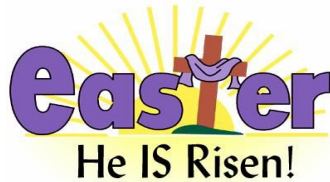

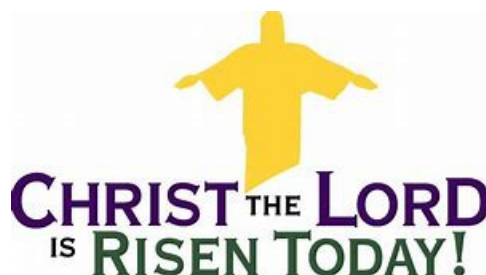
