A NOTE FROM

FATHER DANIEL...

Good Shepherd Sunday during the Year of the Eucharist

This weekend we celebrate the Risen Christ as the Good Shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep. Jesus laid down his life for each one of us at Calvary. We all reenter and celebrate that act of redemption every time we celebrate the Sacred Liturgy. Through the celebration of the Eucharist, Jesus the Good Shepherd and High Priest, completes the work of our Redemption. In the celebration of the Eucharist, Jesus accomplishes this work through the collaboration of ministers. First among these ministers is the Priest, who ordained into the ministerial priesthood of Jesus Christ, offers the sacrifice in the person of Christ himself. Led by and united to the priest, all the baptized configured to Christ, the priest and Good Shepherd, also offer their own sacrifice by their active participation in the Liturgy. Our active participation in the Sacred Liturgy is not to be taken lightly, for through our collaboration, Jesus the Eternal Priest, completes the work of our redemption. We participate actively in the liturgy by an open and prayerful disposition, by intentionally singing and responding, by meditating on what God is doing for us, by our reverent partaking in Most Holy Communion. We also participate actively in the Liturgy and collaborate in Jesus' work by fulfilling a number of different liturgical roles.

Today, as we celebrate that Jesus accepted the calling from the Father to become one of us and to lay down His life for us as the Good Shepherd, I invite all to remember that through our Baptism, they were called to continue Christ's Mission, that through Baptism we were configured to Christ the Priest. I invite all to reflect on how that calling might be specified in your life.

Today, I invite all young men and their parents to prayerfully consider if their Baptismal Call is being specified as a calling to the Sacred Priesthood of Jesus Christ. Consider the gifts you have been given, consider the needs of the Church, consider the immense good a priest can do, and ask yourselves if God is calling you to step up and offer your life.

Today, I invite all to consider with a generous heart how they can collaborate with this redemptive work of Christ in the Liturgy and in doing so lay down their lives for their brothers and sisters. We will be offering training for all liturgical roles during May. Please consider stepping up to serve in one or more of these roles. See insert for dates of training and a sign-up form.

I especially want to encourage all the children who will be celebrating their First Holy Communion this year to live their new closeness to Jesus, truly present in the Most Holy Eucharist, by signing up to be Altar Servers . I also want to ask all the youth celebrating their Confirmation to step out and proclaim the Gospel, like the Apostles at Pentecost, and become Cantors and/or Readers. I ask all members of our community to prayerfully consider signing up to be Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Greeters, Ushers, Readers, and/or Cantors or if you prefer a less public role, to sign up to clean the sacred linens used during the celebration of the Eucharist, to be Sacristans, or to help those who work to create a beautiful environment in our churches.

Do not worry about not knowing how to do these tasks, as I will be offering very careful training in May (see insert for dates). If the dates offered do not work for you, sign up anyway and we will find a time to train you that works for you. We were all Baptized into Christ, Priest, Prophet and King, Our Good Shepherd—let's all respond to this beautiful gift of Baptism but collaborating in Christ's act of redemption through the Sacred Liturgy and in this way lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters.
