**A NOTE FROM
FATHER DANIEL...**

Who am I, in the Risen Christ?

The season of Easter has seven Sundays. During the first three, we hear the narratives of the encounters of the disciples with the Risen Christ so that we, too, might hear the Good News: Jesus is victorious over sin and death, He is Risen, He is alive! So that we, too, might encounter the Risen Christ and find hope, the certainty that God will be victorious in us as well. The following four Sundays in the season are meant to help us rediscover who we are in the Risen Christ. This is a season of resurrection and new life for us, too. We remain the same, yet we are new. We can discover this newness by being reminded of what is our relationship with Jesus and with one another. These four Sundays invite us to let go of our old and broken self images, to let go of the masks of fear and embrace our true identity, as children of God, made in God's image, being made into the likeness of Jesus Christ through the Holy Spirit. Last Sunday we heard that Jesus is the Good Shepherd; he knows us and we know him, he cares about us and lays down his life for us. In hearing this, we are invited to rediscover ourselves as loved and cared for, we are to rediscover ourselves not as the fallen children of Adam and Eve, but the children of God born to this marvelous adoption through the sacrifice of Christ our Good Shepherd and High Priest. **I am not damaged goods. I am God's beloved child, cleansed in the water and blood that came out of Jesus' side, in Baptism, in the Eucharist.** This week, we hear Jesus say, I am the Vine and you are the branches. We are invited to leave behind any image of individualism or self-sufficiency, to embrace and celebrate the fact that we need others, that more than anything we need Jesus, that without him we are nothing. We are invited to realize that **in Baptism, in the Eucharist we have been grafted onto the true vine, that nothing can separate us from Christ, that His life flows through us and gives us new life always, that we are not alone, and can depend on God, I belong.** Next week, we will hear Jesus say, I no longer call you slaves, but friends, love one another. The invitation could not be clearer, **rediscover yourselves as intimate friends of God and as friends of one another.** It is realizing how deeply we are loved by God that enables us to love one another. We often see our relationship with God as a distant one, but with these words we are invited to **know Jesus as our friend, a close, intimate friend.** The last Sunday of the season, we will hear Jesus pray that we might be one, as Jesus and the Father are one. By these words we are invited to leave behind the idea that we are not connected to each other, and to **rediscover our oneness. We all depend on each other, we are all one. We are invited to live, act, speak, think and pray in a way that acknowledges, reverences, celebrates and builds up that unity.**

May God give us all the grace to leave behind all the false images of ourselves that the evil one uses to hurt us, may we be able to embrace our true identity in Christ as beloved and dependent on Him and on each other.
