This Sacrament is available for individuals upon request, and communal celebrations are periodically scheduled.

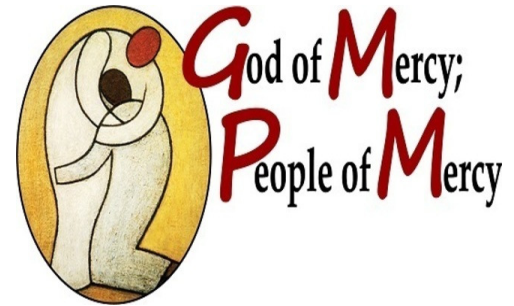
Ministry to the Sick

Next weekend, Fr. Dennis Cleary, a Maryknoll Missionary priest, will preside and speak at all the Masses and give our parishioners an opportunity to take part in the vital work of bringing Christ's name and message to all people.

Father Cleary has served in mission in Venezuela for 17 years. He has also served as the US Regional Superior for the Maryknoll Fathers & Brothers for six years, following which he served in China for a number of years teaching English in Shenyang, and assisting in the coordination of the Maryknoll China – English Teachers Program. Fr. Cleary has also taught at the Korean Catholic Foreign Mission Society Seminary.

Fr. Cleary is currently in the U.S. working to assist international Catholic priests serving here. He also visits parishes for mission appeals.

Those who wish will be invited to sign up for the Maryknoll Magazine. While at the Parish, Father Dennis will be happy to talk with any parishioners who are interested in doing overseas mission work as a Maryknoll Priest, Brother or lay Missionary.
