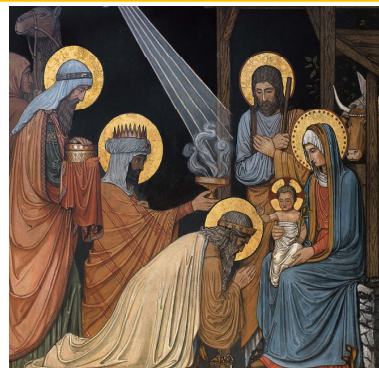

**A NOTE FROM  
FR. DANIEL . . .**

**Continue to follow the star**

This weekend we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord. God reveals the fullness of who he is in his coming to us as a human baby. In baby Jesus, we discover God to be love, we discover God as humble and generous, we discover God as having a preferential option for the poor. The Magi or Three Kings as they follow the star are a symbol for the whole of humanity, for each one of us, as we long to find meaning in life as we eagerly seek love, truth, beauty and goodness. As it was for them, it is for us, the one and only answer to all our longings is Jesus Christ. As we prepare to conclude this Christmas Season with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord on January 8<sup>th</sup>, may we not leave behind this awareness of God's generous revelation to us in Jesus, of his constant presence among us.

This Christmas season we have celebrated that God has entered human history to dwell among us. Every time we celebrate the Most Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, Jesus is made present among us in His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. As we continue to celebrate this Year of the Eucharist, may we grow ever closer to this mystery in which God is always with us. May we always come to Mass, come to pray before the tabernacle where the star shines brightly, and our Lord is with us.

As you know, **I will be going to Colombia to visit my family and enjoy some vacation time. I am leaving on January 9<sup>th</sup> and returning on February 9<sup>th</sup>.** As the shepherd of your souls, my biggest concern is that you have access to the sacraments while I am away and most especially to the Eucharist.

Our **weekend Mass** schedule will remain the same during my absence. Frs. Carsten Martensen, S.J.; Gerry McKeon S.J.; Daniel McMullin; and a Maryknoll Missionary will generously preside at our Sunday Masses (including the Saturday Vigil) and provide for any other sacramental needs that might arise while I am away.

I do not want you to be deprived from the very salutary practice of **daily prayer and Eucharistic devotion** so I have also arranged for the following:

- On Mondays there will be a Word and Communion service at All Saints at 3:00 pm. Mrs. Diane Schaffer will lead this service.
- On Tuesdays there will be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament at Holy Cross from 7 to 8 pm.
- On Wednesdays there will be a Word and Communion service at Holy Cross at 9:00 am. Mrs. Barb Ivers will lead this service.
- On Thursdays there will be a Word and Communion service at All Saints at 9:30 am. Mrs. Christine Eisenhut or Mr. David Lipert will lead this service.
- On Fridays there will be a Word and Communion service at Saint Anthony at 11:00 am. Mrs. Mary Ann Kozak will lead this service.

I have taken great care that those who will be leading the services have sound theological formation and ample pastoral experience, as well as proper training and a profound reverence for the Most Holy Eucharist, and I am assured that you are in very good hands. I encourage all to attend these services.

In terms of **adult faith formation** that I have recently been providing, opportunities will also be in place during my absence:

- Mrs. Mary Ann Kozak will be presenting Bishop Barron's series on Catholicism after the Sunday Mass at Holy Cross.
- Mrs. Barb Ivers will lead a book discussion on Henri Nouwen's, "With Burning Hearts" at Holy Cross after the Wednesday morning service.
- Mrs. Diane Schaffer will lead a Bible Study on the Parables of Mercy at All Saints after the Sunday Mass.
