**A NOTE FROM
FATHER DANIEL...**

Through the liturgical seasons, Mother Church guides us into the heart of the Trinity, God transforms us into the likeness of Jesus Christ

We have recently journeyed through two very intense liturgical seasons: the 40 days of Lent and the 50 days of Easter. During this time we have rediscovered the Father as merciful, through the season of Lent and the sacrament of Confession, we have contemplated the Paschal Mystery of our salvation through Jesus Christ, the Son, during Holy Week and Easter Sunday, and finally we have experienced the love of God that dwells in us, at the coming of the Holy Spirit during Pentecost. Once we concluded these two beautiful and profound seasons, we reenter the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. Ordinary time, which is a season that extends between Christmas and Lent and between Pentecost and Advent, is the longest liturgical season, this year extending for 33 weeks. This season reminds us that in our life most days and moments are not those intense times in which we have major celebrations or in which we come to new awareness. In our life we have life changing seasons, such as falling in love, getting married, having children, becoming a teenager, moving on to college, going through illness, pain, suffering the death of a loved one, but we also have times, probably most of them, in which most things seem routine, just ordinary every day life. These times are in many ways a nice break from the other intense times, but they can also become routinized and we can start to feel like nothing is happening, like we are not doing enough, we might start to lose sense of the meaning of our lives and get lost in the dryness of doing the same things day after day. The color for the Liturgical Season of Ordinary Time is green, the color of hope, which invites us to notice even in the midst of routine the small ways in which our pilgrimage continues, in which God never stops working for our salvation. It also reminds us that the Christian life is a life of continued growth and that we ought to be active and attentive in collaborating with this constant work of God. More than anything it invites us to not lose meaning, to hold onto our commitments, our passions, our vocations as the way to breathe life and meaning into our routines. Sure, getting the children up and ready for school each day can become routine, and after a while you probably know each child's little ways of making that morning routine difficult, but if we keep those simple tasks grounded in our deeper commitments, then they will be meaningful. It can be as simple as reminding yourself early in the morning of the blessings, growth and love your vocation to parenthood has brought into your life, thanking God for that vocation, thanking God for your children and recommitting yourself to your mission of loving them the way God loves you and them, unconditionally. It won't make the morning routine less hectic but it will give you a reason to get through it. What if, just before the children get on the bus or out of the car in school, you take 30 seconds to bless them and tell them you love them as a way to re-center yourself in that vocation, even or especially if between your morning thanksgiving and that moment you already got into little fights? Ritual is important. It breaks through the veil of the routine and reconnects us with the deeper parts of life that are always reasons for celebration. Ordinary time is a time to find little practices to hold on to hope and meaning, to not allow routine to become despair and emptiness. Mother Church in her tender care provides us with two solemnities on the two Sundays following Pentecost to help us transition into ordinary time and to complete our contemplation of the mysteries of our salvation: The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity and The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. In the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we get to contemplate the Godhead as a whole and in this way bring together our contemplation of Father, Son and Holy Spirit through the previous seasons. We also realize that the whole point of all that we have celebrated is that God wants us to be at the center of the Love of the Trinity, that we are invited into the intimacy of God. The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ celebrates the actual way in which even in this life we become part of the Trinity, we enter that love, we are transformed from humanity into divinity, and that way is our constant relationship and encounter with Christ in the Most Holy Eucharist in our participation in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Christ is truly present to us in the Eucharist and every time we attend Mass we enter that intimacy of the Trinity, we are plunged into the love of the Father and through the work of the Holy Spirit, we are transformed more and more into the likeness of Jesus Christ!!!

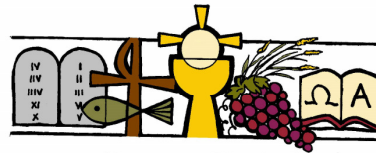
