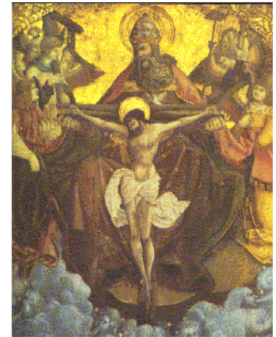

**A NOTE FROM
FATHER DANIEL . . .**

Do you feel guilty sometimes? Have you been holding on to things that bring you shame? Are there situations in your life that hurt you and in which you need God's help?

Good news, we have a sacrament for that: Confession. Our readings this weekend talk about how God so loved the world that he gave his only Son. Jesus died on the Cross so that every time our guilt and shame burden us and we feel that we are at odds with God and experience a human need to settle the score, we do not have to hold on to that feeling because we can always look at the cross and know that our human need to settle accounts has been fully satisfied in the sacrifice of the Son—that in his death and resurrection, we have been reconciled to the Father and that we are always loved and always forgiven.

Every time we participate in the Eucharist, we get to reenter that one sacrifice of Christ, be made whole, rid of guilt and shame and go in peace, reconciled to God, ourselves and others.

Sometimes certain wounds, guilt and shame just linger with us, burden us, make us feel worthless or fall into despair. In those cases, we need a more personalized and careful healing process by which we can let go of that guilt, be assured of God's forgiveness and start a path to healing, peace and freedom. If we have any lingering sense of guilt, shame or woundedness, then we should take the opportunity to approach the Sacrament of Confession and allow God to embrace us in his Mercy and reassure us of forgiveness.

This week, we will have our diocesan Day of Penance and Mercy, and we also have many other opportunities for confession. God knows everything that burdens you, God sees your suffering, God suffers with you and longs to free you from those burdens of guilt and shame. Please give him a chance, please come to Confession!
