**A NOTE FROM  
FATHER DANIEL. . .**

**God wants a little space in our lives  
to reassure us in God's love**



This weekend our readings will talk to us about how Jesus cleansed the temple that had become more a place of business than a place of worship. This Gospel passage speaks to us of the place that God should have in our life. Saint Paul says that we are the temple of the Holy Spirit. Is the Holy Spirit truly at the center of our interior temple, or have we slowly allowed other things to populate that temple and take God's place?

We are all so busy and the demands on our time and resources are just overwhelming! The invitation we receive this week is to gently and slowly try to carve some time and space for God in our lives. It is in that connection with God that we find strength, peace and joy. Simple practices can go a long way in helping us do that. Can we take one minute in our hurried morning routine to bless our children before they leave for school? Can we take a minute to pray before meals? Could we take five minutes once a week to pray with our spouse? Can we talk to Jesus when we find ourselves with a few minutes to spare, maybe as we drive alone, take a shower, or eat a meal on our own? Can we find a little secret that will remind us constantly of God's love and help keep all else in perspective? A little secret is a short phrase that we can constantly repeat to ourselves as we go about our day, that will help us remember who we are, what is important, reconnect us with God and God's love. For example, we can repeat to ourselves: "I can do all things in God who strengthens me", or "under God's wings I find refuge", or "I am God's beloved daughter/son, in me God is well pleased", or "There is nothing I can do to make God love me more, there is nothing I can do to make God love me less."

During Lent, Holy Week and Easter, we have a wonderful opportunity to reconnect with God's love, to re-center our lives and to find peace in God's love. Even though everything else can fail, God's love never fails.

One of the things that crowds our interior temple is guilt, shame, a sense of not being good enough. Can we maybe give the Sacrament of Confession a chance, as a wonderful opportunity for healing, to share what hurts us and experience God's mercy that welcomes us with no judgment and reassures us of his love and saving power in our lives. There are many opportunities for Confession at our three churches that you can find on your Lenten Calendar, and in addition to that, Father is always available for confessions by appointment.

Another wonderful way of reconnecting with God and all that God has done for us is the beautiful celebrations of Holy Week. Can we make an effort to attend those celebrations? The Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday will be at All Saints at 7:00 pm. The celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday will be at 7:00 pm at Saint Anthony, and the Great Easter Vigil will be on Holy Saturday at Holy Cross at 7:30 pm. Holy Week will coincide this year with school break. I encourage all who have plans to travel to see if you can plan ahead to attend at least one of these celebrations where you are going to be.

No matter what shape or form your practices might take, please do not let this Lent go by without hearing God's loving plea that asks you to come home, to come closer to him. There is no sin too great, no past too dark, no wound too deep for God's loving Mercy. God is only asking that you take the risk of coming closer no matter what, so he can embrace you in His love and heal you; please do not let anything keep you away. If you want to talk, or if I can in any way help you find healing, peace and God's mercy, please do not hesitate to ask.
