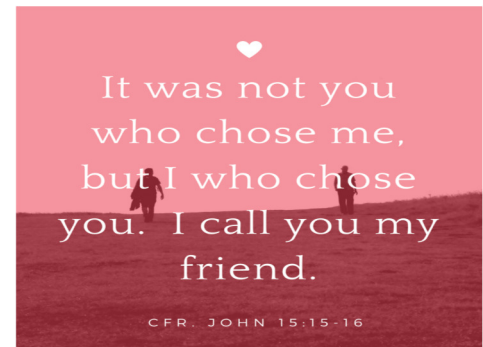

### Welcome!

### Baptism

Baptismal preparation is offered and required for parents of children to be baptized in our churches. Please contact the parish office for an initial interview and baptismal preparation.

### Holy Matrimony

Couples must contact the parish office at least six months prior to the celebration. Marriage preparation prerequisites must be fulfilled before the celebration of marriage.

### RCIA/RCIC

Those interested in becoming Catholic or wishing to complete their Christian initiation through the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist are asked to call the parish office.

### Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

This Sacrament is available for individuals upon request, and communal celebrations are periodically scheduled.

### Ministry to the Sick

Please call a parish office concerning the needs of the sick, hospitalized or shut-ins. Those unable to attend Mass may have Communion brought to them.

What a beautiful gift from God it has been to serve among our generous and faithful parish communities. When I first came, eight months ago, my intent was to do everything I possibly could to help us all find ways to build up our parishes into strong parishes alive in the Holy Spirit. Today, that commitment is ever deeper because now I know and share in your joys and sorrows, your hopes and fears, because your tremendous goodness has left me no other option than to come to love you, and because now that I know your gifts, I know that the Lord has provided us with all the building blocks we need to accomplish the Mission He has entrusted to us.

We have taken some good steps forward, but much remains to be done to fulfill the Mission of Jesus Christ in the whole of North East Tompkins County: “to bring glad tidings to the poor... to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord” Luke 4:18-19.

Throughout this whole season of Easter, we have been reading from the book of Acts that recounts how, guided by the Holy Spirit, the Apostles and first disciples, continued the Mission of Jesus Christ, and putting forward their gifts built up the Church. This is a season for us all to be rekindled with the fire of that Mission, the true meaning of our lives. This is a time to stir up the gifts that God has given us and to use them to build up the church. We do that by sharing our time, talent and treasure.

This is why for the last few weeks there have been inserts in the bulletin inviting us all to truly lay down our lives in service of our brothers and sisters. As I said, I am more than committed to giving my all to building up our parishes, but I cannot do it alone, nor can I do it just with the same volunteers that at each parish tend to do everything. Just with them, we can keep things as they are, but can we truly say that we are doing our absolute best to serve the children of God in our area, that we have transformed our area by the message of the Gospel, that the unity, peace and justice intended by God pervade our everyday lives and those of our neighbors? The Holy Spirit is always calling us to serve better and more, to grow. **The only way that the Holy Spirit will be able to give us new life is if we all put forward our gifts. I am calling on all of you to stir up the gifts that the Lord has given you, so that we can make a difference in the area that Jesus has entrusted to our care: that all will come to know they are loved, that all will be served as children of God, that especially the poor, the sick and the excluded will come to know that God is with them, through our presence. Let us change our little corner of the world, let us set it on fire with the Good News of Jesus Christ!!!**

This week you will find an insert that will ask you for a few things: to **fill in a registration form**, so that we can either add or update your information in our system and keep in touch with all the exciting things that will happen in our communities; to **sign up to be part of existing ministries**, such as different liturgical roles, or our parish life/social ministry committees or to **sign up to be part of new ministries**. ## Special Service at St. Anthony Cemetery

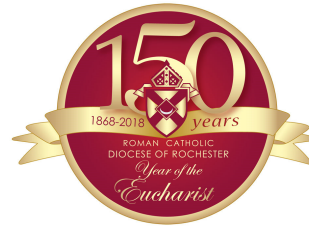
